Congratulations to Paul Sanders, Chair, Phillip Kimball, Co-Chair and members of the Advocacy Committee.

In order to achieve this top level of national recognition, the Advocacy Committee is required to demonstrate their engagement at the State legislative and national congressional level. They are required to attend the annual National Health IT week in DC, accomplish five outreach initiatives,

attend via teleconference nine monthly calls and complete nine monthly tasks.

Representatives from the UHIMSS Advocacy Committee will be attending National Health IT week in DC, September 15-19, as part of the HIMSS initiative to educate congressional representatives on health IT recommendations and concerns.

At our August 14 luncheon, many members enjoyed and were enlightened by Deb LaMarche, Associate Director of the Utah Telehealth Network and Dr. Terry Box, Associate Professor in the Department of Internal Medicine at the University of Utah School of Medicine. We would like to extend a special Thank You to ViaWest™ for providing our lunch and Intermountain Healthcare for hosting the event at their beautiful Doty Family Education Center. Utah Telehealth Network (UTN), has adopted the Project ECHO model established and directed by Dr. Sanjeev Aroya, MD at the University of New Mexico School of Medicine. The mission of Project ECHO (Extension for Community Healthcare Outcomes) is to develop the capacity to safely and effectively treat chronic, common, and complex diseases in rural and underserved areas, and to monitor outcomes of this treatment. This is accomplished by providing rural physician access to specialists to discuss cases. Through this process, rural physicians become more knowledgeable in diagnosing and treating chronic and complex cases. The outcome of rural patients treated by their provider through telehealth access to specialists has proven to be equivalent to the outcome of patients being treated in urban environments. Due to current CDC grants, current access to UTN services for rural areas in Utah is at no cost to start up and link to the UTN site. We extend our thanks to Deb LaMarche and Dr. Terry Box for sharing the impact that they are having in rural patient outcomes through Telehealth in Utah. We anticipate the presentation slides being available in the Past Event section on the new UHIMSS website www.Utah.himsschapter.org after September 8.

We are actively planning for a webinar in October, details to be available soon in early September as well as an exciting speaker for our Holiday Luncheon in December. Netsmart partnered with Allscripts

Healthcare payment reform is stimulating (forcing!) some deep transformation in healthcare delivery. Health information technology companies are coming together in a variety of ways. Recently this month, Netsmart, an electronic health records developer based in Overland Park, Kansas that specializes in behavioral health, and Allscripts announced a collaborative agreement to enable providers using Allscripts' Sunrise EHR for hospitals to view records in Netsmart's myAvatar CareRecord and vice versa. The expected outcome from the Netsmart-Allscripts partnership is to enable providers using Allscripts' Sunrise EHR for hospitals to view records in Netsmart's myAvatar CareRecord and vice versa. Furthermore, they are planning to integrate Netsmart's behavioral health EHRs with Allscripts EHRs for ambulatory care. This type of strategic alliance is not new as we remember that Cerner in 2012 acquired Anasazi Software of Tempe, Ariz., a specialist in software for community based behavioral health providers.

Cerner acquired Siemens

In an effort to prepare for Population health management earlier this month Cerner spent \$1.3 billion to purchase Siemens Health Services, the health information technology business of Germany Siemens AG. The two companies to form a strategic alliance to bring new solutions to market that combine Cerner's health IT leadership and Siemens' strengths in medical devices and imaging. Siemens' experience with revenue-cycle management products could help Cerner evolve with the healthcare IT market need in that matter.
